<p>Mary Seacole 23rd November 1805 – 14th May 1881 - Born in Jamaica (North America)</p>		<p>Mary Seacole helped soldiers in the Crimean War. Because of all her efforts, the soldiers called her “Mother Seacole” as she comforted them and nursed them back to health.</p>
<p>Nelson Mandela 18 July 1918 – 5th December 2013 - Born in Mvezo (South Africa) (Africa)</p>		<p>Nelson Mandela was the first black South African President. He spent 27 years in prison for trying to change things so that they were equal for both black and white people.</p>
<p>Barack Obama 4th August 1961 – Present Day - Born in Hawaii (USA) (North America)</p>		<p>On 4th November 2008, Barack Obama became the 44th American President. He is the first African-American president in the United States of America.</p>
<p>Alice Coachman 9th November 1923 – 14th July 2014 - Born in Georgia (USA) (North America)</p>		<p>Alice Coachman was an African American athlete, who specialised in the high jump. In London in 1948, she became the first black woman to win an Olympic gold medal.</p>
<p>Rosa Parks 4th February 1913- 24th October 2005 - Born in Alabama (USA) (North America)</p>		<p>Rosa Parks was a civil rights activist who refused to surrender her seat to a white passenger on a segregated bus.</p>
<p>Bishop Wilfred Wood 15th June 1936 – Present day - Born in Barbados, Caribbean (North America)</p>		<p>Wilfred Wood became the first black Bishop in the Church of England. He was Bishop of Croydon from 1985 to 2003. In 2004, the British people voted him second in the 100 “Great Black Britons” list.</p>

We will look at Africa and Asia in more detail in Geography lessons.



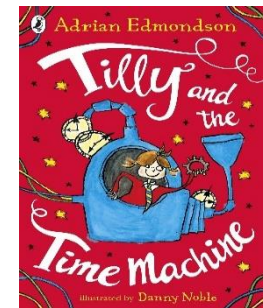
Black History Month Facts:

- Black History Month takes place annually in October in the UK and in February in America.

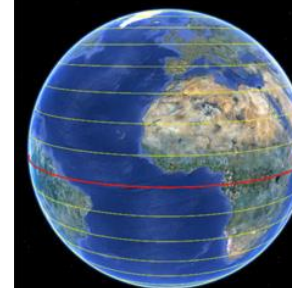
Key Vocabulary

Transparent	Allowing light to pass through so that objects behind can be distinctly seen.
Translucent	Allowing light, but not detailed shapes, to pass through; semi-transparent.
Opaque	Not able to be seen through; not transparent.
Transmit	Cause (something) to pass on from one person or place to another.
Reflect	(Of a surface or body) throw back (heat, light, or sound) without absorbing it.
Absorb	Take in or soak up (energy or a liquid or other substance) by chemical or physical action.
