Year 4 Multiplication Check (Up to 12x12)

- The Year 4 multiplication tables check is a requirement for all schools and takes place from June every year.
- The multiplication tables check is an **online test** for pupils in Year 4.
- Pupils are asked to answer **25 questions** on times tables from **two to 12**. They are given **six seconds per question**, with three seconds rest between each question so the test should last less than five minutes.
- > We will share results with you in end of year reports.
